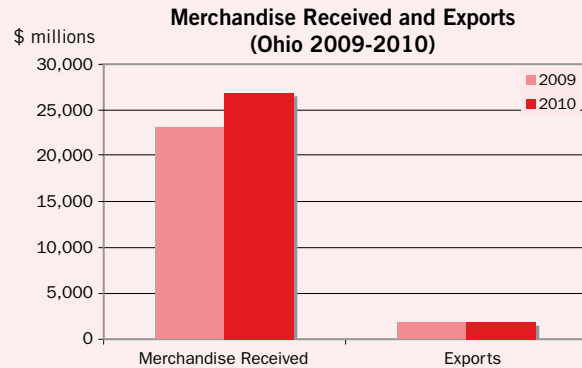

## ZONE DEVELOPMENT

The value of merchandise received by Foreign-Trade Zones (FTZs) in Ohio increased **16.4%** from \$23.1 billion in 2009 to \$26.8 billion in 2010.

Exports from Ohio FTZs increased **1.3%** from \$1.80 billion in 2009 to \$1.83 billion in 2010.

The FTZs in Ohio served a total of **122 businesses**, including **9 subzones**, and employed **25,548 workers** in 2010.

## OHIO FOREIGN-TRADE ZONES

### No. 8 Toledo, Ohio

FTZ No. 8 had 3 subzones and served an additional 4 businesses in the GPZ. All subzones in the zone continued to serve the petroleum industry during FY 2010. The businesses in the GPZ primarily imported metals, sugar, citric acid and tires. The value of merchandise received into the zone increased 7.3%, while exports from the zone increased from 0 to \$79.7 million during FY 2010.

### No. 40 Cleveland, Ohio

FTZ No. 40 had 1 subzone and served 1 business in the GPZ. The business in the GPZ primarily imported metal cutting tools, while the business in the GPZ manufactured welding machines, welding consumables and fluxes. During FY 2010, the value of merchandise received into the zone increased 13.8% and exports from the zone increased 18.6%.

### No. 46 Cincinnati, Ohio

FTZ No. 46 had 3 subzones and served 1 business in the GPZ. The business in the GPZ primarily imported, warehoused and distributed injection molding machines, while the businesses in the subzones manufactured engines, parts and components for aircraft, and automobile engines, driveshaft and crankshafts along with motorcycles. During FY 2010, the value of merchandise admitted into the zone increased 11.0%, while exports from the zone decreased 6.3%.

### No. 100 Dayton, Ohio

FTZ No. 100 had 0 subzones and served 1 business, Gosinger, Inc., in the GPZ. The firm used the GPZ to store and distribute imported machine tools from Japan and Switzerland. During FY 2010, the value of merchandise received into the zone increased 140.0%, while exports from the zone remained at 0.

## OHIO FOREIGN-TRADE ZONES

### No. 138 Franklin County (Columbus), Ohio

FTZ No. 138 had 0 subzones and served 102 businesses in the GPZ, a net increase of 4 businesses operating in the zone during FY 2010. Medicaments were the main merchandise imported and distributed by the businesses in this zone. The value of merchandise received into the zone increased 78.6%, while exports from the zone declined 50.0% during FY 2010.

### No. 151 Findlay (Toledo), Ohio

FTZ No. 151 had 1 subzone and served 0 businesses in the GPZ. Cooper Tire & Rubber Company, the operator of subzone 151A, used the subzone to manufacture, warehouse and distribute tires. During FY 2010, the value of merchandise received into the zone increased 18.6%, while exports from the zone remained at 0.

### No. 181 Akron/Canton, Ohio

FTZ No. 181 had 1 subzone and served an additional 4 businesses in the GPZ. Marathon Petroleum Company LLC, the operator of subzone 181A, used the subzone facility to refine crude oil. The businesses in the GPZ mainly focused on importing, storing, repackaging and distributing products like pigments, chemicals, tobacco and manufacturing equipment. Due to the surge in business activity in subzone 181A, the value of merchandise admitted into the zone increased 41.3% and exports from the zone increased 48.4%.
